The choice of surgery will depend upon the results that have proven successful in our hands to give the highest quality of vision and best visual acuity outcomes. There are drawbacks and positive aspects to each type of laser vision correction.

The factors that are taken into consideration in determining which procedure is best for you would be;

1. Ocular dryness,
2. Type of prescription
3. Need for bifocals
4. Lifestyle considerations such as military and vocational activity
5. Cornea and orbital characteristics
6. Tolerance for discomfort
7. Price, and
8. Time necessary for visual recovery and healing.

Thin flap LASIK tends to have an immediate visual recovery time with very little discomfort so that the majority of our patients return to our office seeing 20/25 the day after surgery. They are very excited and happy to refer their friends and family members to our office immediately.

Epi-Laser or modern surface treatment requires two and a half to four and a half days for visual recovery. Many of these patients have high prescriptions and dry eyes, and because of their difficult prescriptions, obtain better vision outcomes. They have, many times, a higher quality of vision than thin-flap LASIK even though they must go through a longer healing process.

Though they can not be guaranteed, we are hopeful that the end results meet the patient's needs and goals.
